House Bill 4087

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Task Force on School Safety.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of State Police for purposes of task force.

Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2017 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to school safety; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency.

- **3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**
- 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on School Safety is established, consisting of 13 members 5 as follows:
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- (a) The Superintendent of State Police or the superintendent's designee.
- 7 (b) The Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training or the
- 8 director's designee.
- 9 (c) The Governor's Public Safety Policy Advisor.
- 10 (d) The Governor's Education Policy Advisor.
- (e) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the
 Senate.
- (f) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among
 members of the House of Representatives.
- 15 (g) The Governor shall appoint seven members as follows:
- 16 (A) A member of the Oregon State Sheriffs' Association;
- 17 (B) A member of the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police;
- 18 (C) A member of the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association;
- 19 (D) A member of the Oregon Education Association;
- 20 (E) A member of the Oregon School Boards Association;
- 21 (F) A member of the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts; and
- 22 (G) A member of the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators.
- (2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting
 members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.
- 25 (3) The task force shall:
- 26 (a)(A) Develop a request for proposals to be published by the Department of State Police
- 27 for hiring a vendor to create a database of floor plans for all schools within the state, ac-
- 28 cessible to authorized users via the Internet; and
- 29 (B) Make recommendations to the Department of State Police for the development of

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1 administrative rules governing the database, including but not limited to:

2 (i) Specifying the persons and agencies that may have access to the database;

3 (ii) Identifying the persons or agencies that will maintain the database; and

4 (iii) Regulating the manner in which database records are added or modified;

5 (b)(A) Examine models of existing education and training programs for law enforcement 6 officials, other first responders and school administration officials in the area of school 7 safety and incident response; and

8 (B) Develop coordinated statewide training in the area of school safety and incident re-9 sponse for law enforcement officials, other first responders and school administration offi-10 cials in consultation with the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training; and

(c) Examine models for existing protocols for school safety and incident response and
 consider whether standardized statewide school safety and incident response protocols would
 be appropriate.

(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the
 transaction of business.

(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting
 members of the task force.

(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson and one of its
 members to serve as vice chairperson.

20 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-21 ment to become immediately effective.

(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

24 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

(10)(a) The task force shall submit a report concerning the floor plan database in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary as appropriate no later than September 1, 2014.

(b) The task force shall submit a report concerning statewide training and statewide school safety and incident response protocols in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary as appropriate no later than October 1, 2015.

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(11) The Department of State Police shall provide staff support to the task force.

(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Department of State Police for purposes of the task force.

(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist
the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating
to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force
consider necessary to perform their duties.

44 <u>SECTION 2.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-45 ated to the Department of State Police, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the

- 3 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 1 of this 2014 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2017
- 4 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

5 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2014 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 6 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2014 Act takes effect 7 on its passage.

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
