(1)(a) The State Chief Information Officer shall advise the executive staff 3 members of state agencies, boards or commissions who have responsibility for developing, 4  $\mathbf{5}$ acquiring, maintaining or implementing information technology resources with respect to: 6 "(A) Emerging information technologies and emerging business trends; 7 "(B) Current and future information technology issues and opportunities; "(C) Strategies to maximize effective and efficient uses of enterprise and shared services 8 9 technology efforts; and 10 "(D) Individual agency, board or commission information technology plans. 11 (b) In addition to the advisory responsibilities described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, the State Chief Information Officer has the following powers, duties and responsi-12 13 bilities: 14 "(A) To identify information technology initiatives that involve participation from more 15than one state agency, board or commission or that involve all or a significant portion of one 16 state agency's, board's or commission's personnel or resources; 17 "(B) To form and lead governance structures and workgroups to plan and implement in-18 itiatives identified under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph using shared services, and to 19 oversee the implementation of the initiatives; 20 "(C) To specify priorities for initiatives identified in subparagraph (A) of this paragraph 21and verify that the initiatives are implemented according to the specified priorities; "(D) To review state agency, board and commission information technology budget pro-2223posals; 24 "(E) To ensure that individual state agency board and commission information technol-25ogy plans align with and conform to the Enterprise Information Resources Management Strategy and other state government information technology strategic plans; 26 27"(F) To support and maintain this state's shared services and information technology 28portfolio; and 29 "(G) To evaluate and recommend any necessary adjustments to state agency, board or commission information technology plans, policies or budgets. 30 31 "(c) In undertaking the duties and responsibilities described in paragraph (b) of this 32subsection, the State Chief Information Officer and executive staff members of state agencies, boards and commissions who have responsibility for developing, acquiring, maintaining 33 34 or implementing information technology resources shall work to provide or assist in provid-35ing services that:

1 "(A) Enable the executive staff members to gain an informed analysis and understanding

of state agency, board or commission business processes that require information technology
solutions;

4 "(B) Implement cost-effective and efficient acquisition and deployment of products and 5 services; and

"(C) Rigorously govern, manage and oversee information technology initiatives.

"(2) On or before each date on which the Legislative Assembly convenes in regular ses-7 sion, the State Chief Information Officer shall deliver to the Joint Legislative Committee on 8 Information Management and Technology a report that describes the progress the State 9 Chief Information Officer has made in undertaking the duties and responsibilities specified 10 in this section, the challenges the State Chief Information Officer has faced and the statu-11 tory changes or resource allocations that are necessary to support continued or better im-12plementation.". 13On page 7, line 13, delete "December 31, 2016" and insert "June 30, 2015". 14 In line 14, delete "Sections 1 and 1a" and insert "Section 1". 15
