House Concurrent Resolution 202

Whereas Reserve Sergeant Scott Collins served as a volunteer sheriff's reserve deputy with the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office for nine years preceding his death; and

Whereas Reserve Sergeant Collins had taken on coaching and supervisory duties of newer reserve deputies; and

Whereas Reserve Sergeant Collins enjoyed helping people and being outdoors and served in the Mt. Hood Ski Patrol; and

Whereas Reserve Sergeant Collins was survived by his mother, Geraldine Collins, father, Elbert Collins, and sisters, Dawn Waddington and Colleen Tavarez; and

Whereas Reserve Sergeant Collins served his community with the ultimate sacrifice of his life; and

Whereas Reserve Deputy Mark Whitehead had completed the Reserve Academy and served as a volunteer sheriff's reserve deputy with the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office for nine months preceding his death; and

Whereas Reserve Deputy Whitehead loved music, was employed teaching music and was involved in the Portland Youth Philharmonic for many years; and

Whereas Reserve Deputy Whitehead's long-range goal was to be a full-time law enforcement officer; and

Whereas, at the time of his death, Reserve Deputy Whitehead was survived by his mother, Bev Whitehead, his father, Jim Whitehead, and his brother, Matthew Whitehead; and

Whereas Reserve Deputy Whitehead served his community with the ultimate sacrifice of his life; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

That we, the members of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, recognize and honor Reserve Sergeant Scott Collins and Reserve Deputy Mark Whitehead for their service to this state.
