On page 1 of the printed bill, line 3, after the first semicolon delete the rest of the line and delete line 4 and insert "amending ORS 390.134; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency."

On page 2, yfter line 28, insert:

- "(d) The counties may not use the moneys received under this subsection to supplant moneys otherwise made available to the counties for the acquisition, development, maintenance, care and use of county park and recreation sites.
- "(e) On or before January 15 of each odd-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly, the State Parks and Recreation Director and a representative of the directors of county park and recreation sites shall submit a report to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means created by ORS 171.555, or the Joint Interim Committee on Ways and Means, that describes the measurable biennial and cumulative results of county activities and programs financed by moneys transferred to the counties from the registration of travel trailers, campers and motor homes and from recreational vehicleytrip permits. Notwithstanding ORS 192.230 to 192.250, the report shall be made in a manner as the committee may prescribe."

On page 4, after line 24, insert:

- "(d) The counties may not use the moneys received under this subsection to supplant moneys otherwise made available to the counties for the acquisition, development, maintenance, care and use of county park and recreation sites.
- "(e) On or before January 15 of each odd-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly, the State Parks and Recreation Director and a representative of the directors of county park and recreation sites shall submit a report to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means created by ORS 171.555, or the Joint Interim Committee on Ways and Means, that describes the measurable biennial and cumulative results of county activities and programs financed by moneys transferred to the counties from the registration of travel trailers, campers and motor homes and from recreational vehicle trip permits. Notwithstanding ORS 192.230 to 192.250, the report shall be made in a manner as the committee may prescribe."

On page 5, delete lines 12 through 14 and insert:

"SECTION 3. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 669, Oregon Laws 2013, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Parks and Recreation Department, for direct services is decreased by \$1,121,258 to offset increased distribution to counties for the acquisition, development, maintenance, care and use of county park and recreation sites.

"(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (5), chapter 669, Oregon Laws 2013, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Parks and Recreation Department, for community support and grants is increased by \$112,126 for increased distribution to counties for the acquisition, development, maintenance, care and use of county park and recreation sites.

"(3) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (4), chapter 669, Oregon Laws 2013, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Parks and Natural Resources Fund to the State Parks and Recreation Department, for direct services is increased by \$1,121,258."
