Senate Bill 1515

Sponsored by Senator STARR; Senator BEYER (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes work group to examine feasibility of Internet voting. Requires work group to report findings to Legislative Assembly before December 1, 2014. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to elections; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 SECTION 1. (1) The Secretary of State shall convene a work group to examine the fea-

5 sibility of Oregon adopting statewide Internet voting.

6 (2) The work group shall investigate:

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7 (a) How Internet voting could increase elector participation in elections, with an em-

8 phasis on Oregonians serving in or with the Armed Forces of the United States;

9 (b) The estimated costs and savings associated with an Internet voting system;

(c) Best practices that may be derived from the experience of Internet voting by other
 states, countries and businesses;

(d) Best practices that may be derived from the adoption of innovative approaches and
 protections currently used by private industry for Internet banking, shopping, education and
 work;

(e) How Internet voting may be used to increase the confidence of electors in the integrity and transparency of the electoral system, including through the creation of hard copies
of backup records, the comprehensive monitoring of critical computer systems and the
availability of regular third-party audits and result verification;

(f) How Internet voting may be integrated with Oregon's existing online voters' pamphlet
 to make the electoral system more user-friendly;

(g) How Internet voting should be structured to fully comply with federal election laws;
 and

(h) Any additional issues the work group deems necessary to evaluate the feasibility of
 Internet voting.

(3) The work group shall prepare a final report detailing its findings. This final report
 shall be provided to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly with subject matter
 authority over elections before December 1, 2014.

(4) The final report must identify any strategies that require rule adoption by the Sec retary of State and any strategies that require additional legislation.

(5) The work group may accept technical assistance from any source in preparing its
 recommendations.

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1 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2014 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015

2 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

3 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2014 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

4 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2014 Act takes effect
 5 on its passage.

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
