2 Whereas Thomas Vaughan served as Executive Director of the Oregon Historical Society from
3 1954 to 1989; and

4 Whereas during those 35 years of service, Thomas Vaughan transformed the Oregon Historical
5 Society into an internationally recognized institution that continues to play a significant role in the
6 lives of Oregonians; and

7 Whereas Thomas Vaughan brought history into the lives of Oregonians through innovative ex-
8 hibits, public programs and vibrant publications; and

9 Whereas Thomas Vaughan's leadership was instrumental in acquiring the largest collection of
10 Oregon-related library and museum materials in the world for the Oregon Historical Society; and

11 Whereas Thomas Vaughan served Oregon by personally reminding Oregonians of their history
12 and the need to preserve that history; and

13 Whereas Thomas Vaughan was declared Historian Laureate of Oregon by the Legislative As-
14 sembly in 1989; and

15 Whereas Thomas Vaughan passed away on December 6, 2013, at the age of 89; now, therefore,
16 **Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

17 That we, the members of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, express our appreciation for
18 the life of Thomas Vaughan and the countless contributions he made to the history and culture of
19 this state; and be it further

20 Resolved, That copies of this resolution be presented to the Oregon Historical Society for dis-
21 play in the Oregon History Museum and to Thomas Vaughan's four children, Meagan Vaughan
22 Becker, Margot Riordan-Eva, Cameron Vaughan-Tyler and Stephen Vaughan.
