

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 4124**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 7, delete “19” and insert “24”.

2 In line 8, delete “19” and insert “24”.

3 In line 10, delete “that”.

4 In line 11, delete the boldfaced material.

5 On page 2, after line 45, insert:

6 **“SECTION 4.** ORS 418.704, as amended by section 1 of this 2014 Act, is  
7 amended to read:

8 “418.704. (1) As used in this section and section 2 of this 2014 Act:

9 “(a) ‘Youth’ means a person 10 through 24 years of age.

10 “(b) ‘Youth suicide’ means a completed or attempted suicide by a person  
11 10 through 24 years of age.

12 “(2) There is established a Youth Suicide Intervention and Prevention  
13 Coordinator within **that part of** the Oregon Health Authority **that works**  
14 **with mental health and addiction issues.** The coordinator shall:

15 “(a) Facilitate the development of a statewide strategic Youth Suicide  
16 Intervention and Prevention Plan to address youth suicide and youth self-  
17 inflicted injury, and develop strategies for intervention with suicidal, de-  
18 pressed and at-risk youth;

19 “(b) Improve outreach to special populations of youth that are at risk for  
20 suicide and self-inflicted injury;

21 “(c) Identify barriers to accessing intervention services for suicidal, de-  
22 pressed and at-risk youth; and

1       “(d) Provide technical assistance to state and local partners and coordi-  
2 nate interagency efforts to establish youth suicide and youth self-inflicted  
3 injury prevention and intervention strategies.

4       “(3) The coordinator shall review data and prepare an annual report to  
5 interim and regular committees of the Legislative Assembly with subject  
6 matter jurisdiction over child welfare, mental health and addiction issues,  
7 and to the Oregon Health Authority, regarding:

8       “(a) The number of emergency room admissions for completed and at-  
9 tempted youth suicides and incidents of youth self-inflicted injury;

10       “(b) The manner and method of completed and attempted youth suicides  
11 and incidents of youth self-inflicted injury;

12       “(c) The counties in which the completed and attempted suicides and  
13 self-injury incidents occurred;

14       “(d) The number of middle schools and high schools with completed youth  
15 suicides among the student body;

16       “(e) The number of completed youth suicides where the youth had previ-  
17 ously been admitted to a hospital or emergency room for treatment of at-  
18 tempted youth suicide or self-inflicted injury or had been the subject of a  
19 request for intervention services related to depression, suicidal ideation or  
20 self-injury within the prior 12 months; and

21       “(f) Demographic information regarding youth who completed or at-  
22 tempted youth suicide or who had self-injury incidents, including but not  
23 limited to:

24       “(A) Age;

25       “(B) Gender;

26       “(C) Race;

27       “(D) Primary spoken language;

28       “(E) Sexual orientation;

29       “(F) The existence of any physical, mental, intellectual or emotional dis-  
30 ability; and

1       “(G) Foster care status.

2       “**SECTION 5. The amendments to ORS 418.704 by section 4 of this**  
3 **2014 Act become operative on August 1, 2014.”.**

4       On page 3, line 1, delete “4” and insert “6”.

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
