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15	"SECTION 2. (1) There is established a State Council for Educa-

20	"(2) The term of office of each member is four years, but a member

- "SECTION 3. (1) Notwithstanding the term of office specified by

- 14 "(a) One shall serve for a term ending July 31, 2015.
- 15 "(b) One shall serve for a term ending July 31, 2016.
- "(c) One shall serve for a term ending July 31, 2017.
- "(d) One shall serve for a term ending July 31, 2018.

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"(Qualification of Members)

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- "SECTION 4. (1) The members of the State Council for Educational Opportunity for Military Children must be residents of this state who are well informed on the principles of education of military children.
 - "(2) The membership must include:
 - "(a) The Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction;
- 28 "(b) The superintendent of a school district with a high concen-29 tration of military children;
- 30 "(c) A representative from a military installation located within

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10	"SECTION 5. (1) The State Council for Educational Opportunity for

13	ers necessary for the performance of the functions of such offices as
14	the State Council determines.
15	"(2) A majority of the members of the State Council constitutes a
16	quorum for the transaction of business.
17	"(3) The State Council shall meet at least once every three months

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23	"(Employees)
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25	"SECTION 6. (1) The State Council for Educational Opportunity for
26	Military Children shall appoint a director to serve at the pleasure of
27	the State Council.
28	"(2) The designation of the director must be by written order, filed
29	with the Secretary of State.

"(3) Subject to any applicable provisions of ORS chapter 240, the

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director shall appoint all subordinate officers and employees of the State Council, prescribe their duties and fix their compensation.

"(Authority to Adopt Rules)

"SECTION 7. In accordance with applicable provisions of ORS chapter 183, the State Council for Educational Opportunity for Military Children may adopt rules necessary for the administration of the laws that the State Council is charged with administering.

"(Oaths, Witnesses, Subpoenas)

"SECTION 8. The State Council for Educational Opportunity for Military Children, the director of the State Council and authorized representatives of the State Council may administer oaths, take depositions and issue subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents or other written information necessary to carry out the provisions of sections 2 to 9 of this 2014 Act. If any person fails to comply with a subpoena issued under this section or refuses to testify on matters on which the person lawfully may be interrogated, the procedure set out in ORS 183.440 shall be followed to compel obedience.

"(Advisory and Technical Committees)

"SECTION 9. (1) The State Council for Educational Opportunity for Military Children may establish such advisory and technical committees as it considers necessary to aid and advise the State Council in the performance of its functions. These committees may be continuing or temporary committees. The State Council shall determine the rep-

resentation, membership, terms and organization of the committees and shall appoint their members.

"(2) Members of the committees are not entitled to compensation, but at the discretion of the State Council may be reimbursed from funds available to the State Council for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties, in the manner and amount provided in ORS 292.495.

"MISCELLANEOUS

"SECTION 10. The unit captions used in this 2014 Act are provided only for the convenience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express any legislative intent in the enactment of this 2014 Act.

"SECTION 11. This 2014 Act is repealed on December 31, 2019.".
