## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4054

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon delete the rest 2 of the line and insert "and declaring an emergency.".

3 Delete lines 4 through 25.

4 Delete <u>pages 2 through 7</u> and insert:

"<u>SECTION 1.</u> The ballot title for chapter 48, Oregon Laws 2013
(Enrolled Senate Bill 833), as referred to the people by referendum
petition for their approval or rejection at the November 2014 general
election, shall be:

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10 ESTABLISHES LIMITED PURPOSE, DURATION DRIVER CARD FOR
 11 INDIVIDUALS WHO PROVE OREGON RESIDENCY, MEET DRIVING
 12 REQUIREMENTS.

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RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote establishes limited purpose, limited duration driver cards, issued to applicants with valid identification, who prove Oregon residency, pass driver tests, pay card fees.

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RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote rejects issuing limited purpose,
limited duration driver cards to applicants with valid identification,
who prove Oregon residency, pass driver tests, pay card fees.

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22 SUMMARY: Current law authorizes State of Oregon to issue driver

license to individual who demonstrates current Oregon residency, safe
 driving ability and other enumerated requirements.

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Measure authorizes the state to issue limited purpose driver card to 4 individual who demonstrates safe driving ability, provides proof of  $\mathbf{5}$ identity and proof of Oregon residency for more than one year, with-6 out requiring proof of legal presence in the United States. Driver card 7 may be used only for the grant of driving privileges, to provide a driver 8 identification number and to identify driver as a veteran, anatomical 9 donor or emancipated minor. Driver card must contain feature to 10 distinguish card from driver license. Driver card is valid for four years 11 instead of eight years for driver license. Measure specifies fees. Other 12provisions. 13

(1) Notwithstanding ORS 250.035, 250.065, 250.067 and <sup>16</sup> 250.085, the ballot title prepared under section 1 of this 2014 Act shall <sup>17</sup> be the ballot title printed in the voters' pamphlet and printed on, or <sup>18</sup> included with, the ballot. A petition seeking a different ballot title may <sup>19</sup> not be filed with the Supreme Court under ORS 250.085 or otherwise.

"(2) The ballot title for chapter 48, Oregon Laws 2013 (Enrolled 20Senate Bill 833), provided by the Attorney General under ORS 250.065 21and certified by the Attorney General under ORS 250.067 (2) is void and 22may not be printed in the voters' pamphlet or printed on, or included 23with, the ballot. Any Supreme Court review under ORS 250.085 of the 24ballot title prepared or certified by the Attorney General for chapter 2548, Oregon Laws 2013 (Enrolled Senate Bill 833), is moot and termi-26nated. 27

"<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2014 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2014 Act takes effect on passage.".

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
