Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 3343

Requires medical assistance program to include 12 months' coverage of prescription contraceptives under specified conditions.

HB 3464 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

HB 3464 is being heard for the purpose of considering an amendment that will replace the original measure. The amendment is posted on OLIS.

Establishes task force to study financing and delivery of health care in this state and make recommendations regarding legislative changes to ensure that quality health care is delivered in cost-effective manner.

HB 3517

Authorizes Oregon Health Authority to provide medical assistance, within available funds, to low income children residing in Oregon if necessary to move toward goals of Legislative Assembly expressed in law and to improve health of Oregon communities.

Work Session

HB 2023

Specifies requirements for hospital protocol for discharge planning involving patient who is hospitalized for behavioral health crisis.

HB 2028

Permits pharmacists to engage in practice of clinical pharmacy and provide patient care services to patients.

HB 2302

Modifies definition of "prepaid managed care health services organization."

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Modifies requirements for health benefit plans consistent with federal law.

HB 2935

Requires governing body of coordinated care organization to include representative from at least one dental care organization that contracts with coordinated care organization.

HB 2948

Specifies additional conditions under which protected health information may be disclosed by health care provider that do not subject health care provider to civil liability.

HB 2951

Requires policies and certificates of health insurance that offer prescription drug coverage to meet specified costsharing requirements.

HB 3145

Requires private pay home care workers registered with Home Care Commission to be subject to at least same standards as licensed in-home care agencies.

HB 3149

Provides that registered nurse who is employed by public or private school may accept order from physician licensed to practice medicine or osteopathy in another state or territory of United States if order is related to treatment of student who has been enrolled at school for not more than 90 days.

HB 3230

Modifies registration requirements for certain residential facilities.

HB 3300

Requires primary care physician to serve specified percentage of medical assistance recipients in order to contract with Public Employees' Benefit Board or Oregon Educators Benefit Board to provide medical care.

HB 3301

Requires insurer to permit naturopathic physician to determine whether naturopathic physician is primary care provider or specialty care provider for purposes of insurer credentials.

HB 3396 **
Creates Health Care Provider Incentive Fund.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

HB 3486

Requires manufacturer of prescription drug with annual wholesale acquisition cost of \$10,000 or more, or with wholesale acquisition cost of \$10,000 or more per course of treatment, to file annual report with Oregon Health Authority on costs associated with prescription drug for previous calendar year.

HB 3356

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/15 AGENDA: Requires Oregon Health Authority to administer program to provide loans to hospitals for establishing new primary care residency programs.

HB 3506

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/15 AGENDA: Prohibits certain restrictions on medical assistance coverage of dentures, partial dentures and tooth extractions.

HB 3513 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/15 AGENDA: Creates Rural Medicaid Access and Development Act to provide financial support to rural hospitals and health care providers and to establish primary care residency programs.

HB 2021

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/15 AGENDA: Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop and implement pilot program through which authority and Department of Education provide services related to oral health education, use of fluoride varnish and daily brushing and flossing for children.

HB 2758

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/13/15 AGENDA: Prohibits carrier or third party administrator from disclosing to persons, other than enrollee who receives sensitive services, information relating to sensitive services provided to enrollee.
