HB 2028

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Permits pharmacists to engage in practice of clinical pharmacy and provide patient care services to patients.

HB 2466

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Modifies requirements for health benefit plans consistent with federal law.

HB 2758

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Prohibits carrier or third party administrator from disclosing to persons, other than enrollee who receives sensitive services, information relating to sensitive services provided to enrollee.

HB 2948

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Specifies additional conditions under which protected health information may be disclosed by health care provider that do not subject health care provider to civil liability.

HB 3149

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Provides that registered nurse who is employed by public or private school may accept order from physician licensed to practice medicine or osteopathy in another state or territory of United States if order is related to treatment of student who has been enrolled at school for not more than 90 days.

HB 3301

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Requires insurer to permit naturopathic physician to determine whether naturopathic physician is primary care provider or specialty care provider for purposes of insurer credentials.

HB 3396 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Creates Health Care Provider Incentive Fund.

HB 3464 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Establishes task force to study financing and delivery of health care in this state and make recommendations regarding legislative changes to ensure that quality health care is delivered in cost-effective manner.

- HB 3506
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/15/15 AGENDA: Prohibits certain restrictions on medical assistance coverage of dentures, partial dentures and tooth extractions.
- HB 2125 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Credits
Extends sunset for tax credit for rural medical care.
- HB 2222 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires superintendent of Oregon State Hospital to establish and implement program for hiring relief positions consisting of health care personnel who provide specified services.
- HB 2231
Prohibits coordinated care organization from requiring organizational providers to produce information that is redundant with respect to or outside scope of on-site quality assessment of organizational provider conducted by Oregon Health Authority.
- HB 2369
Requires Department of Human Services to establish by rule responsibilities of case manager who receives notice of life-sustaining procedures for principal for purposes related to withholding or withdrawing those life-sustaining procedures.
- HB 2522 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates Islander Health Coverage Gap Assessment Office in Oregon Health Authority to promote access to health care for island citizens residing in United States under Compact of Free Association.
- HB 2683
For the purpose of making an announcement.
Requires Oregon Board of Dentistry, upon request of individual who has been disciplined by board, to remove from its website and other publicly accessible print and electronic publications information related to disciplining individual if individual meets certain criteria.
- HB 2696
Requires Oregon Health Authority to collaborate with coordinated care organizations to develop uniform audit processes and forms to be used by authority and contractors of authority.
- HB 2876
Prohibits health care facility from allowing person without certain qualifications to practice surgical technology.
- HB 3100
Changes governmental framework for conducting public health activities in this state and for providing public health services to residents of this state.
- HB 3347
Modifies definition of "person with mental illness" as used in civil commitment statutes.
- HB 3427
Prohibits insurers from reducing reimbursement paid to health care providers by more than five percent for more than two consecutive years, and prohibits further reductions without approval of Department of Consumer and Business Services.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 3534
Requires premises where person makes retail sales of tobacco products and inhalant delivery systems to be licensed by Oregon Liquor Control Commission.
- HCR 23
Honors Ron Post for establishing Medical Teams International and improving lives of Oregonians and millions of others worldwide.
