HB 3364

Modifies definition of "intellectual disability" as used in developmental disability services program.HB3391 ****Subsequent Referral(s) to Judiciary

Requires Attorney General to file action on behalf of Department of Human Services employee for stalking citation or stalking protective order upon request and upon substantiation of facts and evidence of repeated and unwanted contact causing alarm or coercion to employee.

HB 2029 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Department of Human Services to prescribe income limits for temporary assistance to needy families program that are equal to 66 percent of federal poverty guidelines.

HB 2564

Repeals law that prevents local governments from imposing conditions on approved permits that effectively establish sales price for residential development or limit purchase to class or group of purchasers.

HB 2889

Requires Department of Human Services, child-caring agency and foster home to ensure child receiving care or services from department, agency or home establishes savings account in child's name for child's sole use and benefit upon child reaching 12 years of age.

HB 2890

Requires Department of Human Services, child-caring agency and foster home to ensure provision of minimum of one extracurricular activity, where available at school or in community, to child receiving care or services from department, agency or home.
