HB 2201 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes task force to study gambling in Oregon and to make recommendation for legislation on regulation of gambling in this state.

HB 2413

Requires Department of Human Services to report to Legislative Assembly changes necessary to achieve goal of reducing long term care facility bed capacity.

HB 3420 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Housing and Community Services Department, with advice of State Housing Council and in collaboration with Community Action Partnership of Oregon and Department of Human Services, to develop, implement and administer Housing First Program for purpose of providing housing assistance, case management and support services to individuals and families experiencing homelessness by utilizing continuum of care.

HB 3535

Modifies temporary assistance for needy families program to promote employment and financial stability for families at risk of qualifying for or who qualify for temporary assistance for needy families or who become ineligible for temporary assistance to needy families aid due to employment.

HB 2116 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Tax Credits

Extends sunset for tax credit for employment-related household services and dependent care expenses.

HB 2239 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue

Creates income tax credit for hiring of at-risk or disadvantaged youth.

HB 2959 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Housing and Community Services Department to dedicate and use portion of moneys deposited in certain housing accounts from County Assessment and Taxation Fund for benefit of county from which fees deposited into fund were charged and collected.

HB 3148 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Creates Wildfire Damage Housing Relief Account within Oregon Housing Fund.

HB 3317

Directs Oregon State Lottery Commission, in coordination with Oregon Liquor Control Commission, to report biennially on distribution and concentration of video lottery game terminals in relation to socioeconomic status of neighborhoods or communities in which premises of video lottery retailers are located.

HB 3318

Establishes Oregon State Lottery Responsible Gaming Code of Practices.
