Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2557 A

Creates process by which person found guilty except for insanity can apply to court for order setting aside judgment of guilty except for insanity.

Work Session

HB 2341

Authorizes court to order defendant to pay extradition costs when defendant is found in violation of probation.

HB 2349

Requires petition for appointment of professional fiduciary to include information regarding investment credentials, licensing, compensation and method for assessing or charging compensation.

HB 2392 **

Requires Department of Human Services to issue specified types of public assistance through electronic benefits transfer card.

HB 2393

Requires Oregon State Lottery to hold lottery prize in excess of \$600 that is owed to person that has not repaid overpayment of public assistance or medical assistance benefits.

HB 2394

Requires Director of Oregon State Lottery to provide information about lottery prize recipient to Department of Human Services within seven days after paying lottery prize of \$1,000 or more.

HB 3156

Changes circumstances under which enforcement of child support order may be suspended.

HB 3157

Repeals outdated law regarding enforceability of child support judgments.

HB 3159

Creates debt in favor of state for dishonored checks for support that are presented by third party on behalf of obligor or withholder.
