Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

HB 2776

Authorizes peace officer to apply for and circuit court to enter ex parte emergency protective order when court finds probable cause that person was victim of domestic disturbance or abuse and protective order is necessary to prevent abuse.

Public Hearing and Work Session

HB 2310

Allows Department of Corrections inmates to receive credit for time served for presentence incarceration after arrest for certain crimes related to sentencing crime.

HB 2313

Increases time for conducting preliminary hearing on minor's application for emancipation to 15 days after date of filing.

For the purpose of consideration of amendments.

HB 2315

Increases amount of noneconomic damages that may be awarded in civil action seeking damages arising out of bodily injury.

For the purpose of consideration of amendments.

HB 2316

Repeals obsolete provision relating to jury trials in county courts.

For the purpose of consideration of amendments.

HB 2320

Decreases penalty for crime of cheating to maximum of one year's imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

HB 3406

Requires law enforcement agency that employs police officer involved in use of deadly force, or officer who is victim of violence, to provide officer with paid leave, mental health support resources and other care after incident.

HB 3408 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to provide students with opportunity to explore careers in law enforcement and to become familiar with law enforcement.

Work Session

- HB 2224 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires Department of Human Services to adopt rules for licensing of stabilization and crisis units that house persons with developmental disabilities.
- HB 2425
Permits Oregon Youth Authority and juvenile department to disclose and provide copies of certain juvenile records to Department of Corrections for purpose of exercising custody or supervision of person committed to legal and physical custody of Department of Corrections.
- HB 2571
Requires law enforcement agency to establish policies and procedures for retaining recordings from cameras worn upon police officer's person to record officer's interactions with members of public.
- HB 2647
Enacts Privacy Expectation Afterlife and Choices Act.
- HB 2704
Provides that recording of peace officer or parole and probation officer does not constitute crime of interfering with peace officer or parole and probation officer unless recording actually prevents officer from performing lawful duties.
- HB 3040
Provides that certain hearsay statements related to certain sex crimes are not inadmissible in evidence even though declarant is available as witness.
- HB 3399
Requires justice court or municipal court to record criminal proceedings.
- HB 3525
Provides that person who obstructs reporting of unlicensed immigration consultant commits crime of obstructing governmental or judicial administration.
