HB 2315

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Increases amount of noneconomic damages that may be awarded in civil action seeking damages arising out of bodily injury.

HB 2316

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Repeals obsolete provision relating to jury trials in county courts.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Requires Department of Human Services to adopt rules for licensing of stabilization and crisis units that house persons with developmental disabilities.

HB 2310

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Allows Department of Corrections inmates to receive credit for time served for presentence incarceration after arrest for certain crimes related to sentencing crime.

HB 2313

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Increases time for conducting preliminary hearing on minor's application for emancipation to 15 days after date of filing.

HB 2356

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Increases penalty for crime of invasion of personal privacy if defendant has certain prior convictions or person recorded is under 18 years of age.

HB 2425

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Permits Oregon Youth Authority and juvenile department to disclose and provide copies of certain juvenile records to Department of Corrections for purpose of exercising custody or supervision of person committed to legal and physical custody of Department of Corrections.

HB 2571

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Requires law enforcement agency to establish policies and procedures for retaining recordings from cameras worn upon police officer's person to record officer's interactions with members of public.

- HB 2647
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Enacts Privacy Expectation Afterlife and Choices Act.
- HB 3040
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Provides that certain hearsay statements related to certain sex crimes are not inadmissible in evidence even though declarant is available as witness.
- HB 3388
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Authorizes reserve officers sponsored by law enforcement unit to pay for training as police with cash and G.I. Bill education benefits.
- HB 3437
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Establishes procedures for applying for Certificate of Good Standing eligibility certification and petitioning for and issuance of Certificate of Good Standing.
- HB 3498
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/20/2015 AGENDA: Provides that applicant for registration by State Marine Board as outfitter and guide may not have been convicted of certain offenses preceding application.
