Public Hearing and Work Session

HB 2206

Renames crime of patronizing a prostitute to commercial sexual solicitation.

HB 2326

Provides that when conditional discharge probation has expired but defendant has not fulfilled terms and conditions, case shall not be dismissed.

HB 2336 A

Allows filing and service of notice of appeal by mailing or dispatch for delivery within three calendar days via United States Postal Service or commercial delivery service.

HB 2385 A

Provides that person commits crime of luring a minor if offense involves police officer posing as minor or agent of police officer posing as minor.

HB 2420 A

Provides that community mental health program director or director's designee shall consult with criminal defendant found unfit to proceed, prior to decision on commitment, to determine availability of treatment in community .

HB 2628 A

Disallows all filing fees, service fees and hearing fees in action for court's protective stalking order, even if stalking order is not only relief sought in action.
