
2015-17 Governor's Budget Outcomes-Based




- The budget is about priorities, not programs
- Focused on achieving outcomes over 10 years through strategic spending and investments
- Investing in areas of change and innovation
- Governor started with flat funding at 2013-15 biennium spending levels
- General Fund and Lottery Funds revenues are projected to grow at approximately 11 percent
- 2015-17 biennial revenue growth is projected to add \$1.8 billion in General Fund and Lottery Funds resources

10-year goals

Public Safety Strategies for Change



- Our approach to address the major issues:
 - o Maintain current Public Safety efforts
 - o Find savings to reinvest in prevention of future costs
- Tools we will use to overcome issues:
 - o Fund community efforts to reduce prison use
 - o Divert and reform youth offenders
 - Add state troopers and vehicles
 - o Replace aging data systems
 - o Address deferred maintenance, other facilities needs
 - o Fund mental health crisis intervention training

Insert Program Area 2015-17 Governor's Budget/ Co-Chairs' Framework

- Co-Chairs' Framework provides less General Fund and Lottery Funds
 - Governor's Budget provides \$2,329.5 million General Fund and Lottery Funds
 - Co-Chairs' Framework provides \$2,272.9 million
 General Fund and Lottery Funds
 - o Co-Chairs' Framework is \$56.6 million lower
