Long Term Care Ombudsman Budget

The members of the Campaign for Oregon's Seniors & People with Disabilities support the Long Term Care Ombudsman budget allocations contained in the Governor's Recommended Budget (GRB).

The recommendations contained in the GRB are a welcome change from the drastic reductions to essential senior safety net services that we have faced in the midst of the most recent economic downturn.

The Campaign appreciates the continued investments in the Long Term Care Ombudsman office that now has expanded responsibilities due to legislative action. One of these news responsibilities is serving about 7,800 adults and children living in licensed foster and small group homes for Oregonians with mental illnesses and developmental disabilities. The second new role is a state-wide public guardianship and conservatorship program for vulnerable persons who need this protection but have no family or friends to help them. Sufficient resources are essential for the office to carry out these new responsibilities.

The Long Term Care Ombudsman office is a prime example of efficient government services, as much of their charge is accomplished through a robust cadre of trained and dedicated volunteers. This office protects the rights of thousands upon thousands of residents of long term care communities across Oregon, and serves an absolutely vital role.
