Re: Please Support SB 132

---

Salem Health is comprised of Salem Hospital, West Valley Hospital, Willamette Health Partners and other affiliated health care organizations offering exceptional care to people in and around Oregon's mid-Willamette Valley since 1896. Salem Hospital is one of the largest of Oregon's 59 acute care hospitals and operates the busiest emergency department in Oregon. It is a not-for-profit hospital, licensed for 454 acute-care beds.

Salem Health respectfully requests the **support SB 132**, which amends ORS 163.165 to add people working in hospitals to the list of professions who, if they are ***intentionally, knowingly or recklessly assaulted*** while performing their jobs, the crime is a class C felony.

The workers currently covered by ORS 163.165 include professions who, like hospital staff, are ***required to serve all members of the public***: emergency medical services (ambulance) personnel, youth correction facility staff, public transit vehicle operators, taxi drivers.

Intentional ***violent acts against hospital staff occur despite extensive training*** of hospital employees about how to prevent violence as well as how to recognize and de-escalate potentially violent situations.

***Most other states have already taken action*** to enhance criminal penalties for assaults against hospital employees; currently, at least 31 states have enhanced penalties, including Washington.

SB 132 ***does not remove any protections for mentally ill or impaired patients*** who may be violent, but are not able to form criminal intent.
