I am Ashley Buckle's Mother, and I am here to support and represent her and other women and children in the state of Oregon.

Our current system lacks justice and accountability to these predators that commit invasion of personal privacy. Currently in the state of Oregon, the laws allow someone to enter your home, place a camera, in the privacy of your own bedroom and bathroom, retrieve that camera, view and use the videos as often as they like and for whatever purposes they wish. These videos are now forever in cyberspace for anyone to view.

We were in shock to be told that in the state of Oregon these crimes are only considered a misdemeanor and perpetrators do not have to register as a sex offender after committing these crimes, including minors.

It is nearly impossible to put into words the pain, fear, and devastation that my family, friends, and myself have suffered. We are not only victims of this crime, we are also victims of the lack of enforcement due to current Oregon laws.

We feel strongly that the Oregon law must be changed. Invasion of Personal Privacy needs to be a felony and that the perpetrators register as a sex offender.
