SUMMARY

Creates position of State School Nursing Consultant in Oregon Health Authority and specifies duties.

Establishes Task Force on School Nursing. Sunsets task force on December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to school nursing; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The position of State School Nursing Consultant is 5 created in the Oregon Health Authority. The responsibilities of the 6 consultant include, but are not limited to, all of the following:

7 (1) Coordinating and collaborating with the school nurse specialist
8 within the Department of Education.

9 (2) Providing school nursing policy and program guidance for the 10 authority, the department and other agencies.

(3) Supporting and leading the integration of coordinated school
 health teams and providing assistance in sustaining the teams.

(4) Providing technical assistance to school nurses on the delivery
of nursing care using evidence-based best practice standards and assisting in the establishment of protocols and standards of care in collaboration with professional associations and state agencies.

17 (5) Providing leadership in the delivery of nursing services in
 18 schools.

19 (6) Providing clinical consultation and technical support to school

2 (7) Serving as a liaison and expert resource in school nursing and
3 school nursing programs for local, regional, state and national health
4 care providers and policymaking bodies.

5 (8) Coordinating school nursing program activities with public 6 health, social services, environmental and educational agencies as well 7 as other public and private entities.

(9) Monitoring, interpreting, synthesizing and disseminating information relevant to changes in health care, school nursing practices,
laws and regulations and other legal issues that impact schools.

(10) Promoting quality assurance in school nursing programs by
 initiating and coordinating a quality assurance program that includes
 needs assessment, data collection and analysis and evidence-based
 practices.

(11) Representing school nurses in state level partnerships between
 agencies and between public and private entities, to foster a coordi nated school nursing program and other multidisciplinary collab orations.

19 SECTION 2. (1) The Task Force on School Nursing is established.

(2) The task force established by this section consists of 14 members
 appointed as follows:

(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from
 among members of the Senate.

(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one
 member from among members of the House of Representatives.

26 (c) The Governor shall appoint 12 members as follows:

27 (A) One member who represents education service districts.

(B) One member who represents a school district that primarily
serves an urban area.

30 (C) One member who represents a school district that primarily 31 serves a rural region.

1 (D) One member from the Oregon Health Authority who is involved 2 in school health.

3 (E) One member from the Department of Education who is involved
4 in school health.

5 (F) One member who is a member of a statewide nonprofit organ-6 ization that is an association organized by and for Oregon school 7 nurses.

8 (G) One member who represents a statewide nonprofit organization
9 that is a professional association for nurses in this state.

10 (H) One member who represents a labor organization representing 11 nurses in this state or who is a classified school employee working 12 directly with school nurses to provide care to students.

(I) One member who represents a statewide nonprofit organization
 that is dedicated to developing school-based health centers.

(J) One member who represents a coordinated care organization
 that provides health services in this state.

17 (K) One member who represents a private insurer in this state.

18 (L) One member who is a local public health official.

19 (3) The task force shall:

(a) Examine existing funding sources for school nursing and re commend ways to balance resources between education and health
 care to achieve the level of school nursing services required under ORS
 336.201.

(b) Recommend standards of school nursing practices that include
 outcome measures related to health transformation and academic
 performance.

(c) Recommend ways to create a coordinated school health services
model and to foster and promote a noncompetitive strategy that is
collaborative and that directs an appropriate level of funding to school
nursing and school-based health centers.

2 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a ma3 jority of the members of the task force.

4 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chair5 person.

6 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority 7 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

8 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
9 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task
10 force.

(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of
 the task force.

(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided
 by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to
 an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to education
 or health care no later than September 15, 2016.

(11) The Department of Education shall coordinate with the Oregon
 Health Authority to provide staff support to the task force.

(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legis-19 lative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reim-20bursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by 21them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and 22amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in 23performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds ap-24propriated to Department of Education for purposes of the task force. 25(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are 26directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, 27to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish 28such information and advice as the members of the task force consider 29necessary to perform their duties. 30

31 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 2 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31,
