






- Agency's emerging issues:

 - Economy and Jobs. "Oregon supports a diverse, dynamic and sustainable economy that drives job creation and prosperity for all."


Expenditure History + 2015-17 Governor's Budget

Investments

- Improving water quality and restoring watersheds (Policy Package 310)
- Controlling invasive species, including the protection of sage grouse habitat (Policy Package 320 & 390)
- Enhancing the integration of natural resource agencies with Regional Solutions and regulatory streamlining (Policy Package 410 & 450)
- Improvements to laboratory Infrastructure and capacity (Policy Package 220)

2015-17 Governor's Budget





- Investments (continued)
 - Provides funding for the parity of administration costs (Policy Package 110)
 - Ensuring food safety compliance in Ballot Measure 91 implementation (Policy Package 501)
 - Continues the Hemp Inspection Program (Policy Package 420)
 - Fees were administratively established in January 2015
 - Supports Senate Bill 257 to increase penalties for violations related to pesticide applications

Fee Changes

- Motor fuel quality (SB 254)
- o Fertilizer registration and tonnage fees (HB 2443)
- Nursery Fees and Wholesale Seed Dealer Fees were administratively changed in the current Biennium (HB 5003)
