I am a Human Service Specialist III working at the Gold Beach APD Office

I am writing in support of HB 3037. I don't believe just because I work for the public that my personal information should be public record to anyone that requests it. I understand that my name, my job, my workplace, my salary, and my retirements public but not my personal information such as my personal cell phone, address where my family lives, and personal identification information such as drivers license.

This is personally important to me because of my past. 11 years ago while working for the State of Oregon I was in a domestic violence situation with my daughters father, that put my children and I in a very unsafe situation. At that time in my life I had to pack my children up and move to an unknown address and keep things very private.

I want to stress how I am no longer a victim of DV, I still feel threatened by this mans presence in my town. I am constantly looking over my shoulder. At this time he does not know where our home is or what our phone number is.

My husband and I have bought our home and don't have the option to pack up and move our family of seven children and ourselves. We keep the location of our home private and use other means for mail and deliveries because of this.

I would really like you to consider this when voting on HB 3037
