Chair Read, and Members of the committee.

My name is Alyssa Chiampi and I am a second year student at Western Oregon University, and I am here with the Oregon Student Association to tell you why I think it is crucial that HB 2662 is passed this session.

I am a low income, first generation college student. I grew up just outside of Medford and chose Western Oregon University because it was the more affordable option when selecting a state school. When I decided to attend a higher educational institution, I really had to swallow the thought of never having my American Dream. Growing up in a low-income household I was taught that higher education was the answer to helping me move up the economic ladder, but due to the burden of student loan debt I know that my reality might be that I stay stagnant. The thought of owning my own home, purchasing a newer car, or pursuing other rites of passage will never be a reality when I will already be graduating with at least \$25,000 and have to scramble after graduation to find a decent job to start paying back on my loans. I worry about being able to find a job quickly after graduation that will support paying back my loans without having to defer. The world runs off credit and if I am unable to pay back my loans I know this will impact my upward mobility.

HB 2662 could change all of that; HB 2662 could give me and other students the opportunity to be able to finance college in a way that leaves us with our heads above water. This pilot program is a solution to student's dilemma of crushing debt loans, and inability to participate in our economy after graduation. I would be able to attend college without questioning if my education was worth it. Education is a right, and HB 2662 gives us a better opportunity at being able to create our American Dream by attending a higher educational institution without worry if we are worth spending the rest of our lives paying off our education. We are worth it, and education should not be a debt sentence.

This is why I support HB 2662, and encourage you all to support it.
