

## Employment Department Agency Overview






- Agency's emerging issues:

#### Investments

- Conduct an internal assessment of technology needs in the following program areas:
  - Unemployment Insurance program
  - Business and Employment Services divisions
  - Workforce and Economic Research divisions
- Secure the agency's Oregon Payroll Reporting System and address changes in Federal laws

2015-17 Governor's Budget





#### Investments (continued)

- Make use of Congress's reauthorization of the Trade Act program; funding that benefits workers who have lost jobs due to foreign competition
- WorkSource Centers redesign
- Transfer the Office of Administrative Hearings to the Department of Administrative Services
- Support the agency's existing contracted services, which include:
  - Jobs Opportunity Basic Skills Program
  - Temporary Assistance fro Needy Families (TANF)
  - Oregon Food Stamp Employment Transition Program
  - Vocational Rehabilitation Services Program
