Aging and People with Disabilities

- Older Adults (over 65); or
- Adult with a disability determination (physical in nature)

AND

- Meet level of care requirements (service priority levels)

Office of Developmental Disabilities Services

- Individuals affected by one or more of the following:
 - Down syndrome, Cerebral palsy, Autism spectrum disorders, Acquired brain injury (in childhood), Drug affected children, Intellectual disability

AND

- Meet level of care requirements

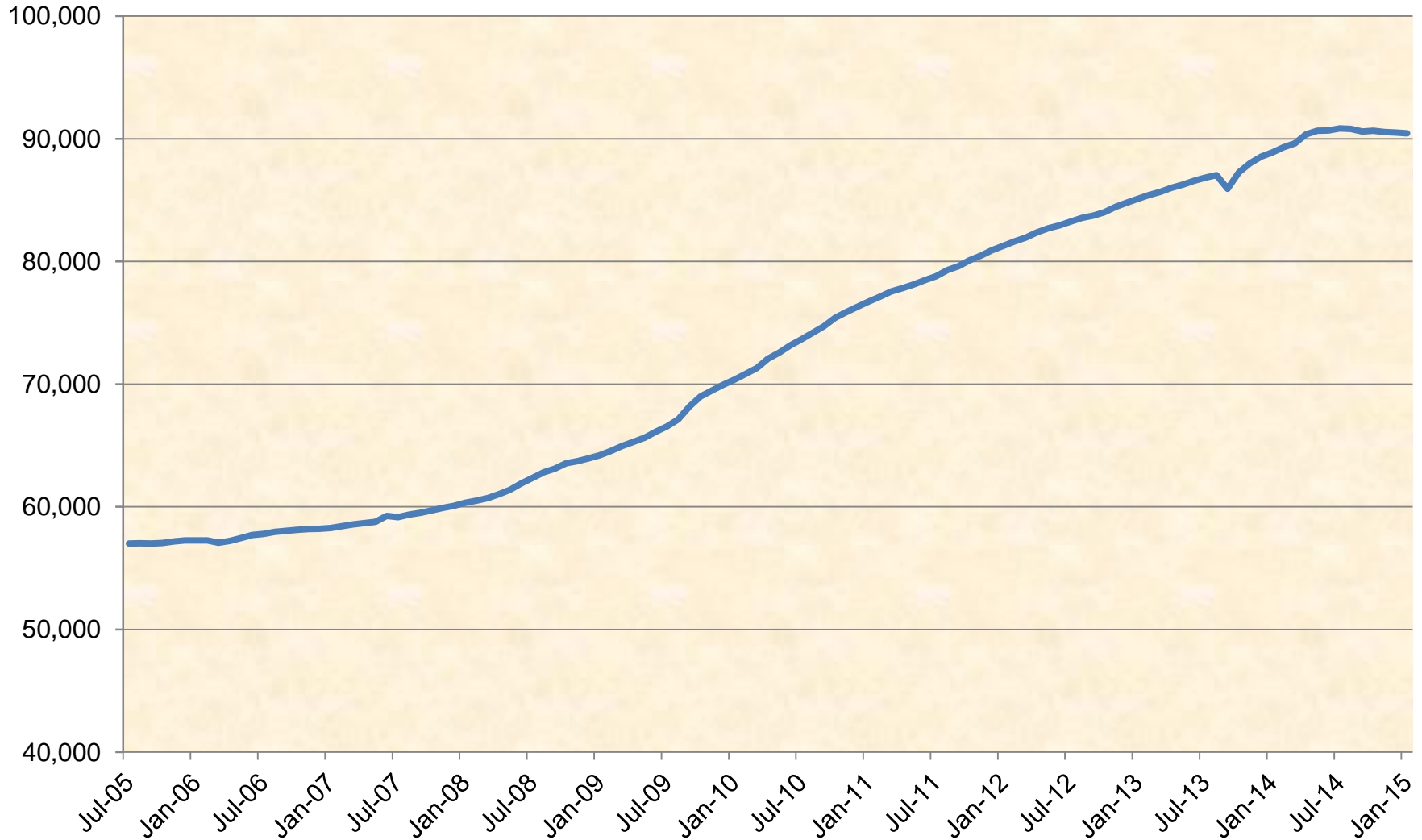
Federal Disability Determination Criteria

- Inability to engage in any substantial gainful activity(SGA),
 - by reason of a medically determinable physical or mental impairment(s)
 - which can be expected to result in death **or**
 - which has lasted or can be expected to last for a continuous period of no less than **12** months.
 - Must consider age, education, and past work experience.

Disability Determinations

- Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI)
- 1 of 4 20-yr olds will become disabled by 67
- 204,000 Oregonians on SSI/ SSDI (2014)
- \$175M in payments per month (2014)
