






- 10-year plan vision

Expenditure History + 2015-17 Governor's Budget






Total Funds Budget by Category (\$ in millions)

(\$ in millions)



Agency Totals Fund Budget by Program (\$\$ in millions)



Total Fund Budget by Program with Health Care Programs Broken Out (\$ in millions)







2015-2017 Governor's Budget





- Continue to prioritize Health System Transformation
 - Medicaid cost growth continues to be capped at two percent below previous trend per Medicaid Waiver
 - Continues to expand access to coordinated care model
 - Continues current provider assessment supporting hospital transformation efforts
 - Public Employees Benefit Board cost growth continues cap at same rate as Medicaid programs
 - Oregon Educators Benefit Board cost growth limited to same initial caps of 4.4 percent and 3.4 percent per member per year
 - Patient Safety Commission investment to improve patient and provider interactions
 - Initial investment in Psychiatric Emergency Department

2015-2017 Governor's Budget





- Mental Health System Investments
 - Additional \$53 million in community mental health programs
 - Continues commitment to improve access to community behavioral health through integration with Oregon Health Plan
 - Prioritizes recent investments in community mental health programs and continues this support through 2015-17 biennium
 - Invests in community evaluation and treatment of certain aid and assist populations
 - Continues phase in of the Oregon State Hospital Systems

2015-2017 Governor's Budget





- Public Health Investments
 - Invests in preparedness and planning efforts
 - Invests in Task Force on Future of Public Health Services
 - Supports fee increases for Radiation and Protection Services, Newborn Screening program
 - More analysis continues on Public Health's fee supported programs
