

Open Oregon State, in partnership with OSU Libraries and OSU Press, is being recognized for an open textbook initiative that aims to ease the financial strain on students.


IN the NEWS

Textbooks/Course Materials

- Top 6 highest enrolled courses over 1 million dollars
- More than half (63%) reported not having purchased the required textbook because of the high cost
- Given a choice between courses to satisfy a requirement students are not taking the class that interests them, they are choosing the one with the least expensive textbook.



At OSU $$30.00 \times 400 = $12000/year$







\$259.00 X ~ 150 students per term = ~ 38,000

Each year = ~ \$155,000 that students are not spending on JUST THIS COURSE

As of October 2014 there are over 100,000 downloads of this book!





California – two bills – SB 1052 and SB 1053 passed in 2012 top 50 lower division courses

- Openly licensed digital textbooks available at no cost to students
- Print version available for less than \$20

Washington – Top 81 highest enrolled courses.





Several Different Current Projects

- Partnership with OSU Press and OSU Libraries
- Project to fund faculty to adopt an already written open textbook and then write a review
- Project with Summer Session to fund faculty to use open materials for summer courses with no cost course materials.
- Working with LBCC to fund faculty to create additional texts for lower-division courses
