RE: Executive Summary for HB 3035 (2013) Relating to the Oregon Transparency Website

Overview

During the 2013 legislative session, HB 3035 was passed requiring DAS to develop a plan to add additional contracting information to the transparency website, including information for school districts and community colleges. This executive summary and the associated report are intended to meet the requirements of HB 3035. In addition to meeting the requirements contained in HB 3035, DAS has developed a high-level plan for the future of the website as a whole. This work was done in an effort to meet stakeholder needs without the need for additional legislation.

Method of Analysis

The Office of the Chief Operating Officer (COO) and the Chief Information Office (CIO) worked collaboratively to develop a response to HB 3035 and also develop a high-level plan for the future of the website. This work included documenting what goes into maintaining the website to better understand the current state of the website. To gain an understanding of what would be needed for the future of the site, in addition to meeting the HB 3035 requests, COO and CIO staff worked with external stakeholders, including, members of the Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission, Governor's Office representative, union representatives, associations, and public interest groups.

Findings

Currently, maintaining the transparency website is a manual and time-consuming process. There is one staff person assigned to manage and maintain the transparency website, in addition to their regular duties. Managing and maintaining the website consists of many different activities and tasks, including: oversight, acquiring needed data and information, and website updates. With the amount of work already being performed and the limited resources available it is difficult to make enhancements to the website.

Based on conversations, stakeholders were generally pleased with the amount of information currently available on the transparency website. However, there were several potential upgrades identified related to what stakeholders would like to see in terms of functionality and overall usability of the website.

The other main issue associated with getting information on the website, are the limitations in what data and data sets are readily available. The State of Oregon operates many legacy systems. These systems hold and maintain a vast amount of data and information, but were developed long before the transparency website. In many cases these systems do not have the reporting capabilities needed to easily report data and information. Overtime, system work arounds have been developed to assist agencies with day-to-day data needs, this further increases the complexity of getting and sharing data and information across the enterprise in a standardized format for the transparency website.

Conclusions

HB 3035
