

2015-17 Governor's Budget Investments





- Pathway to Kindergarten Readiness and 3<sup>rd</sup>
  Grade Reading
  - Full day kindergarten
  - Early literacy investment to reach 95% literacy by 3<sup>rd</sup> grade
  - Early learning investments in home visits, early intervention, pre-K to Kindergarten Partnerships, increased funding for early learning hubs, expansion of Employment Related Day-Care
  - Culturally responsive teaching practices including K-12 mentoring, expansion of district collaboration, support for low-reforming districts

- Pathway Connecting Education to Career
  - Expansion of career and technical education programs
  - Support for science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) programs





#### 2015-17 Proposed






Direct Expenditures & Transfers to Other State Agencies








## Oregon Department of Education Expenditure History/2013-15 Governor's Budget







2015-17 Governor's Budget/Revisions





 Move \$15 million El/ESCE investment from Early Learning to Grant in Aid (House Bill 5016, sections 2 & 4).

2015-17 Governor's Budget/Co-Chairs' Framework

- 9
- Co-chairs State School Fund is \$340 larger, including \$34 million for high cost disability grants. Co-Chairs and Governor include \$220 million for full day K. Co-Chairs also
  - Add \$20 million depending on revenue forecast
  - o Possible capital assistance program related to full day-K
- Strategic Investments and Network for Quality Teaching of \$64.4 million, framework is current service level (\$48.7 million).
- Co-Chairs early learning, STEM and CTE programs are \$60 million. Early learning alone is \$85 million less than the Governor's proposal.
