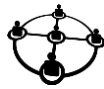

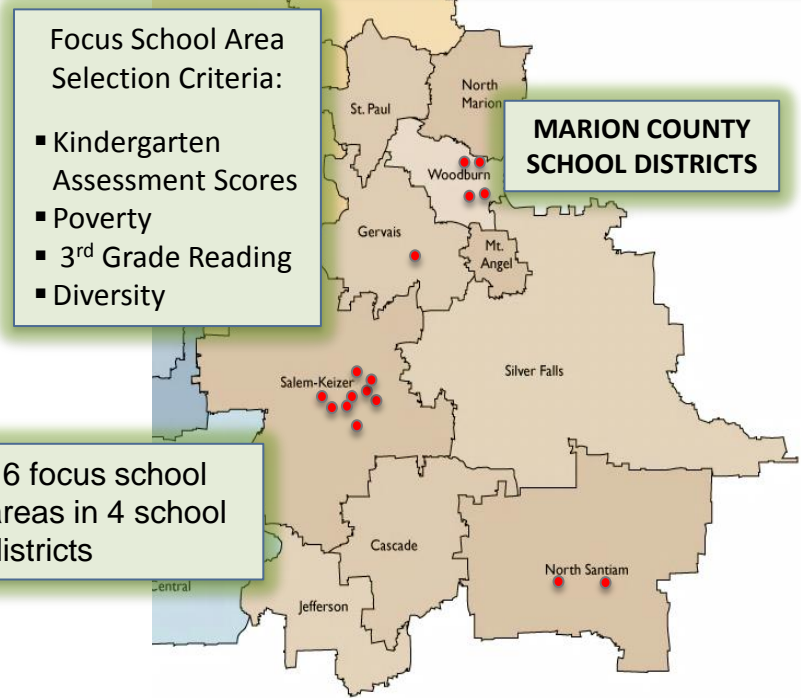
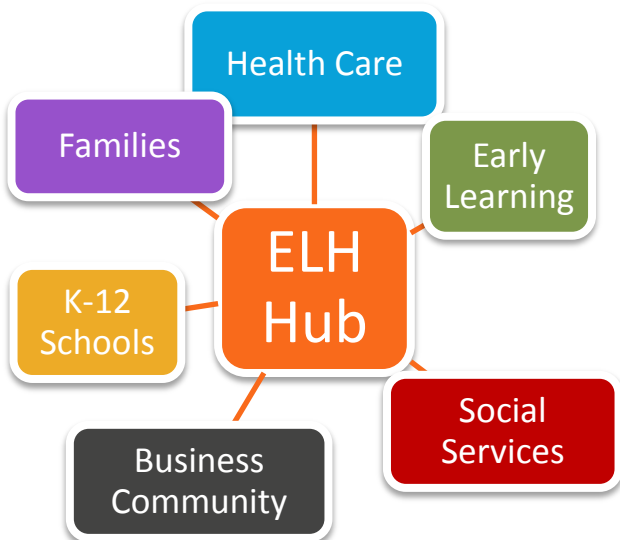

BUILDING A FOUNDATION FOR GRADUATION

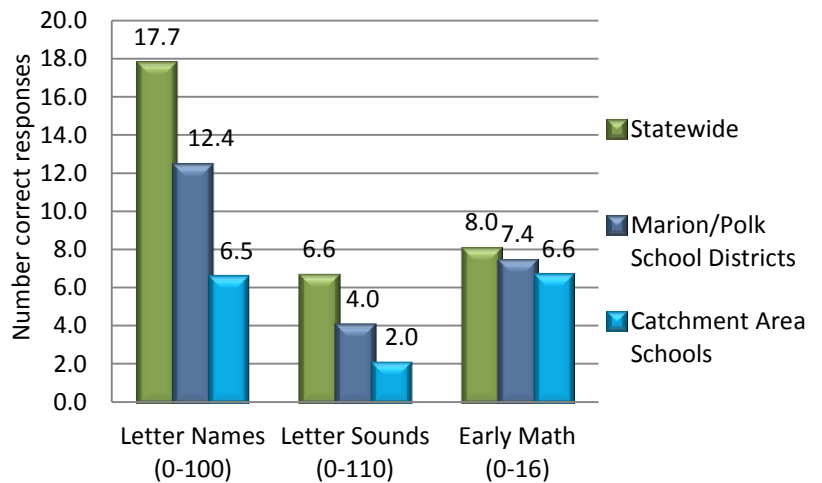
- 3rd grade reading proficiency is the most important predictor of high school graduation.
- 42% of Marion County children are NOT reading proficiently by end of 3rd grade.

The Early Learning Hub is a cross-sector collaboration to leverage resources and meet needs of children and families.



49% of Marion County children entering kindergarten are multicultural; approximately 35.7% are English Language Learners.
