





- Fees and Other Changes
 - o The agency's budget includes the following fee changes:
 - An increase in the Solid Waste Permit fee
 - An increase in the Wastewater Permit fee; includes increase in General Fund investment
 - An increase Ballast Water Management fee; includes increase in General Fund investment
 - An increase Oil Spill Prevention fee
 - Consolidation of and increase in the Solid Water Disposal fee

Appropriation/budget bill changes

- If the agency is awarded federal grants for Community Scale Air Toxics Air Monitoring Grant and Diesel Emission Reduction it will be requesting additional federal limitation and a limited duration position for the Air Toxics grant.
- The agency is seeking to reclassify employees to align their classification with their workload and responsibilities.
