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HB 2728

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- Establishes the Oregon Talent Council (OTC)
- Requires the development of a statewide talent plan,
- Appropriates moneys for specific investments focused on high priority, STEM-centric occupations and skill gaps
- Abolishes ETIC (Tech industry becomes a subcommittee of the OTC)
- Resides within Oregon Employment Department with coordination agreements and policy alignment with HECC, OWIB, STEM Investment Council and OBDD

OTC's Key Duties

- Inform: Works with state to develop a Talent Plan that provides industry verified data on immediate and forecasted skill and occupation gaps and recommends strategic areas of focus for education and training partners
 - Better anticipate employment demands
- Advise & Engage: Acts as a resource and sounding board for higher education and workforce sector strategies, actively seeks industry participation in key efforts
 - Maximize the connection between jobs and education/training
- Catalyze: Establishes the Oregon Talent Council Fund to coinvest in targeted efforts that address critical talent gaps for Oregon's traded sector and high growth industries
 - Seed investment strategy that leverages local, state and federal dollars

Key Coordination Points



- Continued partnership with universities, building on ETIC relationships
- Enhanced partnerships with community colleges
- New partnership with workforce, especially regional sector strategies and focused demanddriven workforce initiatives

March Amendments
