

SB 525 Where do ideas come from? The ideas we throw around usually have history and the history may not even be known to those who propose the ideas.

A bill such as SB525 is proposing to remove guns from those who have a restraining order.

This bill assumes that the person with the restraining order is guilty of needing the restraining order and in need of not having a gun in their possession because they MAY commit a crime with it.

This is like when the Democrats ruled in the South, and assumed that black people would commit a crime if they owned guns. The jim crow laws they enforced, denied guns to some people because other people in the society feared they would commit a crime with it. As you know, there was systematic use of law to deny the possession of guns—a 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment right, to a segment of the population. It took the creation of the Department of Justice, and the designation of lynching as a federal crime to begin to bring justice to people in the southern states, which states had been ignoring the white on black crime, in favor of focus on the possibility of black on white crime—

My thought is that this bill assumes guilt on the part of men toward women and treats them as guilty, even if there has been no crime committed. Can't this create a scenario where women use their fear of a crime to deny men their 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment rights, when the woman would be helped more by exercising her own 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment rights?

When I read this bill I get the idea that fear is being used to expand the rights of the fearful, regardless of the possible innocence of the party that fear seeks to restrain.

When the Republicans made lynching a federal crime, and began to prosecute members of the KKK, doing a job that the Democrat-run states had ignored, a woman named Margaret Sanger visited many KKK groups with the admonition that it wasn't proper for white people to go to prison for killing black people, and that the KKK should use politics and media to induce the destruction of strong community among black people, by using other black people to commit the crime. That way black men would go to prison for committing crime among black people—even though the KKK would have provided the inspiration. The use of policies that would promote the destruction of family in the black community was to be the means of destroying the moral fiber of black young people.

She called this The Negro Project, and when I read a bill of this sort, that assumes the guilt of someone who has had a person take out a domestic restraining-order against them, we need to be careful that we are not advancing the goals of the KKK Negro Project. Since the ideas come from the shadows and the influence is done in secret, we should chase down and destroy ideas that are actually meant to be anti-liberty for certain groups which others may be prejudiced against.

Finally, we had founders that understood how licentious behavior advances government power. I am so thankful for the wisdom of George Washington. He helped me understand how government moves toward power over the people, by encouraging licentious behavior in the people. We are seeing the use of policy in schools to deny young people the hope of the gospel of Jesus Christ, and learning to restrain their licentious behavior for the betterment of themselves, their families, and their communities.
