Chair Read, Members of the Committee:

The Oregon Health Equity Alliance (OHEA) would like to express our support for HB 3308. OHEA represents a collective effort of 37 member organizations who work together to make Oregon a more equitable place for all. Our coalition believes every Oregonian should have an equal chance to achieve their full health potential, and that is why we are supporting HB 3308.

This important bill will address the disparities faced by Oregon students in higher education, especially for our traditionally marginalized, underserved and underrepresented communities. HB 3308 will direct the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to convene a new work group, to analyze and make recommendations on how to address disparities in higher education among underserved and underrepresented communities.
