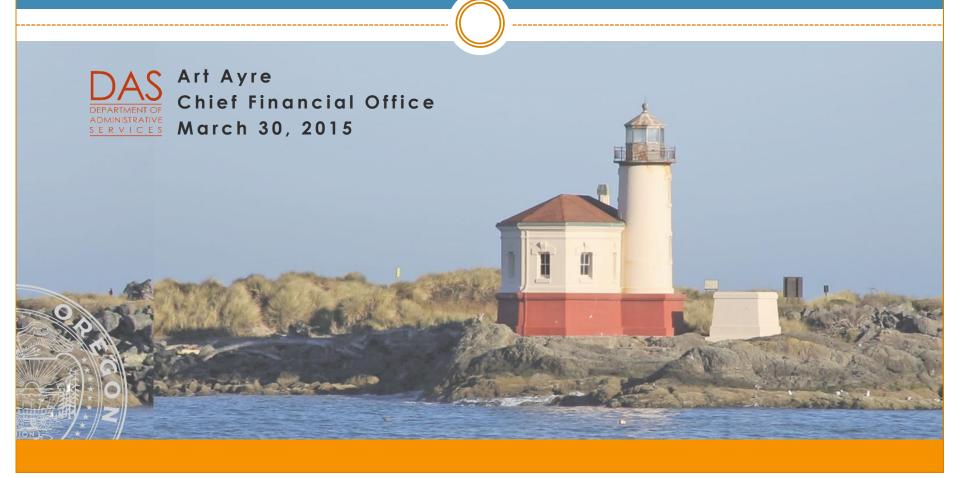

Department of State Police 2015-17 Governor's Budget Overview

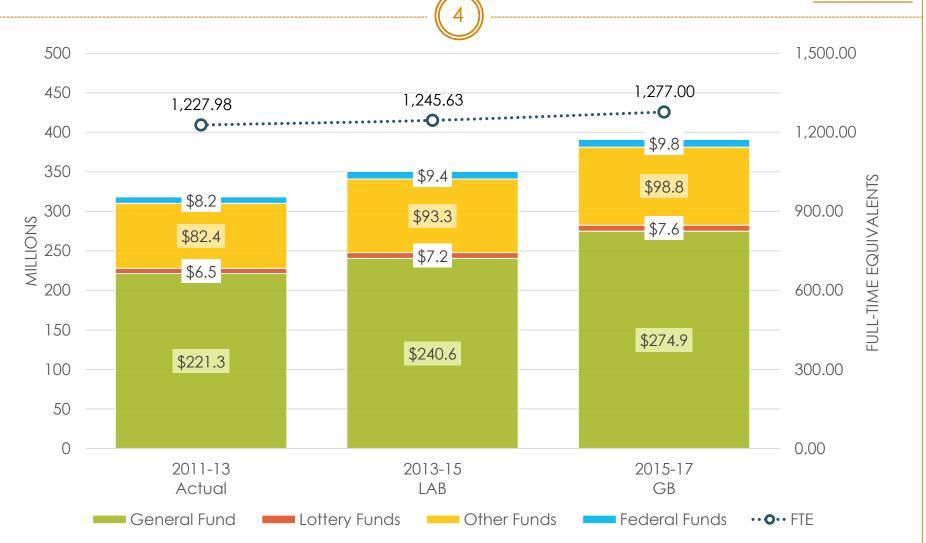

Investments

- Police presence
 - ★ Maintain 17+ Fish and Wildlife troopers
 - 20 additional patrol troopers
 - 33 additional patrol vehicles
- Facilities and tools
 - Beginning of CRIMEvue data system replacement
 - Move Springfield office and forensics lab
 - Move Astoria office out of tsunami zone
- Operational costs
 - Fund use of DAS servers to query Motor Vehicle records
