

Department of Fish and Wildlife Agency Overview






- Agency's emerging issues

2015-17 Governor's Budget



Investments

- General Fund
 - Governor's Budget invests \$8.5 million, an increase of 56.3% over LAB
- Lottery Funds
 - Governor's budget reduces funding \$156,289
- Other Funds
 - Governor's Budget recognizes a revenue shortfall of \$16.5 million, but invests \$7.8 million, an overall reduction of 5.8% from LAB
- Federal Funds
 - Governor's Budget invests \$30.5 million in new proposals but because of one-time funding in 2013-15 there is a \$4.1 million or 3% increase over LAB

Issues

- Task Force on State Department of Fish and Wildlife Funding
- Potential additional federal limitation if grants received
- Appropriation/budget bill corrections
 - Package 102 Revenue Shortfall should increase GF
 - Package 090 data entry error in the shift of Pacific Coast
 Salmon Recovery Fund within agency should reduce GF
