In SB913, there needs to be language in this bill that does not include already existing Ivory that would be associated with items of heritage or inheritance. Right now if the bill were law, I would be a criminal when I hand down to my son items that are over 50 years old which have ivory on them. Am I a criminal?

SB525, This is a very very dangerous law to those who are not criminals or would have no intent to kill another; besides being unconstitutional. One should be able to review divorce case files, for example, and see that SB525 would be added to the list of vindictive ways to "legally" deconstruct a person's life. As an intelligent person, I can assume that your imagination would have confidence enough to foresee such abuses can be a reality; its already happening! It is against the Constitution to take ones rights away without due process and convicted in the court of law. This includes the 2nd Amendment.

I represent 300+ Jackson County Friends of the Second Amendment who all strongly disagree with the unconstitutionality of this law as well as this law opening the door to abuse without due process.
