As a member of the outdoor products industry and as an avid recreational shooter, I strongly protest Senate Bill 941. The burden placed on responsible, law abiding citizens is onerous. Criminals, of course will continue to do what they want and will not be deterred whatsoever in their unlawful behavior. Meanwhile, a resident of Vernonia, like myself would have to plan to travel 25-35 miles to the nearest gun store during business hours and probably during slow business hours to get a gun dealer to process a transaction for me. That gun dealer has nothing to gain by supporting my private sale. We will be wasting his valuable time, so he will likely charge for the transaction. In Washington State, where similar legislation has passed, there are reports of charges of \$75 to complete this transaction. In addition, a law like this would stop my ability to loan a hunting rifle to a disabled vet, like the Viet Nam war Navy special forces warrior who has used one of my elk rifles for the last 2 elk seasons down in Silverton.
