

I am an oncology pharmacist that helps cancer patients fight cancer here in Oregon. On my free time I am a pilot in Oregon. Two of my favorite pilot activities are to:

1) Fly for Angel Flight West. An angel flight is when a pilot flies a person for non-emergent medical treatments, such as required cancer treatments or surgeries who can not afford to get to these treatments because they live far away from the treatments they need. I do this on my own cents. It's a volunteer organization. If the Oregon House Bill 3193 passes, I will be **forced to do less** of these flights. Pilots like me have already likely flown family members or friends of members of the Oregon House of Representatives, or will in the future as long as destructive measures like this are sought.

2) I fly for government and government contracted agencies that test surveillance camera systems to be used to fight drug smuggling behavior in the Gulf of Mexico for the Coast Guard, Fire Fighting to keep our state safe, and animal poaching and human trafficking. Oregon House Bill 3193 will **slow these import developing technologies**. This will put America at risk for **more illegal drugs, more risk for out of control fire fighting, animal poaching, and human trafficking**.

Please explain why you want me to do less of the good that pilots like me are doing for the community of Oregon and the United States of America?

The positive side of UNLEADED fuel concerns are that the FAA has addressed this issue, unleaded fuel replacements are in testing right now for a mandatory release in 2018. This issue is solved.

The amount of lead added to the environment by general aviation is very small, not considered a health risk by *any state or federal environmental or public health agency*. I do not treat cancer patients due to aviation fuel related diseases. Why? Because it does not exist. I do treat patients with cancer related diseases from our food source! This is the tax you should be going after. If a company wants to spray organophosphate chemicals on our fruits and vegetables, they should have to pay into a cancer fund to treat our patients.
