Measure Description:

Authorizes Oregon Department of Administrative Services to adopt rules related to electronic fingerprint capture services.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Administrative Services (DAS), Oregon State Police (OSP), Department of Human Services (DHS)

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Consumer Protection and Government Effectiveness to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. The bill facilitates the implementation of one of the 2013 measures (HB 3168) by continuing the movement of rule-making authority from the Oregon State Police (OSP) to the Department of Administrative Services and allows OSP to delegate processing of fitness determinations from various agencies to the Department of Human Services. The measure will have a fiscal impact, but the amount of this impact is still being determined. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
