Community Corrections agencies provide community supervision including parole, post prison and probation services in all 36 Oregon counties. Heroin use is skyrocketing in very corner of our state. This law will allow individuals to seek medical attention without the fear of arrest. Community safety and the safety of our clients are of paramount importance to us. We will continue to vigorously provide accountability and we will provide services that will assist in long term behavior change. This bill does not change that.
