WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Creates task force on jurisdictional transfers. Sunsets task force on December 31, 2016. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

(-1 amendment) Allows task force to explore jurisdictional transfers to occur from city or county to state as well as from state to city or county.

BACKGROUND: The task force will consist of twelve members, including:

- The President of the Senate shall appoint two Senate members:
 - 1. One member from the Democratic party
 - 2. One member from the Republican party
- The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two House:
 - 3. One member from the Democratic party
 - 4. One member from the Republican party
- The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall jointly appoint six members as follows:
 - 5. One member who is an employee of the Department of Transportation
 - 6. One member who is an employee of the Department of Transportation
 - 7. One member representing an urban county
 - 8. One member representing a rural county
 - 9. One member representing an urban city
 - 10. One member representing a rural city
- The Governor shall appoint two members as follows:
 - 11. One member of the general public
 - 12. One member representing the Governor

The task force will evaluate and make recommendations concerning the transfer of state highways from the state's jurisdiction to the jurisdiction of a city and county. The task force shall submit an initial report by December 1, 2015 and a final report by September 15, 2016.
