We are opposed to SB 941. The biggest reason we are opposed is because it creates restrictions on, and is a clear infringement of our Constitutional Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms. The U.S. Constitution is the supreme law of the land. It can only be changed by process of amendments. There is no law, no statute, no Supreme Court ruling that can override the U.S. Constitution. Therefore if SB 941 is passed by this State Legislature it would be unconstitutional, and as such, is not law.

U.S. Constitution - Article 6 Members of the State Legislatures "shall be bound by Oath or Affirmation, to support this Constitution". Please do so.

As a retired law enforcement officer I was appalled to hear the testimony before the Senate Judiciary Committee this morning by the Lake Oswego Police Chief in support of this bill.

Why? Because this bill places restrictions on an individuals Constitutional right to keep and bear arms. It requires an individual to meet certain qualifications before he can obtain a firearm.
