WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Transfers duties, functions, powers and responsibilities related to information technology, resources and systems; geographic information systems and data; telecommunications and related services from Department of Administrative Services to State Chief Information Officer (CIO). Provides that State CIO is primary advisor to Governor on information technology and telecommunications. Specifies duties, functions and powers of State CIO. Becomes operative January 1, 2016. Declares emergency, effective upon passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendments.

BACKGROUND: The Department of Administrative Services (DAS) supports other state agencies by providing a variety of centralized and shared services, including human resources support, printing, leasing property and administering the state government motor pool. Most functions of state government relating to information technology, geographic information systems and telecommunications are currently housed within DAS; House Bill 3099 establishes a separate State Chief Information Officer (CIO) and transfers these functions from DAS to the State CIO.
