I am also the instructor delivering digital design and fabrication with the mobile Bowmen Fab Lab around the state of Oregon, funded by a CTE revitalization grant. I am delivering professional development to teachers and students around technical subjects and helping grow a sustainable manufacturing ecosystem in Oregon. I want to thank the Oregon Legislature for empowering our efforts to restore CTE opportunities to Oregon students.

I have also been fortunate to teach multiple 3D printing workshops for SuperQuest teacher training workshops in Salem and Roseburg. Both of these experiences have exposed me to a plethora of Oregon technical teachers who are yearning for more training in the skill sets employers are asking us to teach students.
