Subject: SB 895-2

I am writing to express my opposition to SB 895-2 and to express my concern over amendment -2, which is included with this bill yet it has nothing to do with the original intent of SB 895.

Posting the vaccination rate of schools will do nothing more than cause division and spur a modern day witch hunt. You will not raise vaccination rates by bullying families in such a passive aggressive way. This is nothing more than attempt at raising hysteria. The statistics on unvaccinated students are not accurate, since children who receive all vaccines except one are considered "unvaccinated." Nothing beneficial will come from this act.

Amendment -2 will do nothing more than place additional burdens on hard working families. Many Oregonians see Naturopathic (ND) Physicians for their health care needs, as NDs are considered primary care doctors in the state of Oregon. NDs write prescriptions and administer vaccines, just like their MD counterparts, yet this amendment would require families to find a MD, Nurse Practitioner (NP), or Physicians Assistant (PA) with whom they have no prior relationship, to provide vaccine "counseling" and sign a waiver.
