WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Provides that requirement to sell or offer for sale diesel fuel that contains specified percentage of biodiesel or other renewable diesel does not apply to sales in counties east of summit of Cascade Mountains during period from November 1 of any year to February 28 of following year. Allows sale of diesel fuel to which substances have been added to prevent gelling or congealing from October 1 of each year to February 28 of following year. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:

BACKGROUND: In 2007 the Legislature passed House Bill 2210 which required the Department of Agriculture to monitor biodiesel and ethanol production capacity in Oregon and to initiate minimum fuel blending standards statewide for biodiesel and ethanol.

Senate Bill 164 provides an exemption from the requirement that fuel must contain a certain percentage of biodiesel or other renewable diesel in counties east of summit of Cascade Mountains from November 1 to February 28.
