Thank you for taking a moment to read the following thoughts on the matter.

First I want to bring to light this - The more you post anti gun laws, the happier you are making the criminal element.

In my opinion, SB 945 is another means of "Gun control" by our State Government. Please say "NO" to SB 945...

Education of the safe handling of firearms should be foremost in the search for a way to curb accidental discharges of firearms by minors who, in their never-ending curiosity happen to find a firearm and treats it like a toy.

Growing up in a house with firearms I was taught at an early age what they were and the safe handling of them. I have children, and they have been taught at a very early age to respect the firearm and that there is a difference between those in video games, toy replicas and the real deal. They are now in their "Teen's" and "Twenties" and without any incidents.

Do you actually think any parent that owns a firearm want a tragic accident with a minor child and a firearm? Not on your life. If it <u>accidently</u> happens and they get hurt, or killed, don't you think that was enough of a tragedy? That their world has now been torn completely apart?
